Re: Prevent duty guidance – a consultation

4Children welcomes the opportunity to respond to the Home Office's consultation on the "prevent" duty which is being introduced as part of the Counter-Terrorism and Security Bill.


In this short response, we will briefly set out our views on the role of early years and childcare settings in carrying out the new "prevent" duty.

4Children recognises that early years and childcare settings, like all educational institutions, have an important role to play in preventing people from being drawn into terrorism. We are therefore supportive of the principle of early years and childcare settings being designated as a "specified authority" within legislation, and of their consequent inclusion in Schedule 3 of the Bill.

Furthermore, in order to ensure that the "prevent" duty operates effectively in an early years context, we would also emphasise the need for the Early Years Foundation Stage statutory framework to provide appropriate direction for practitioners on how to meet their new responsibilities under the Counter-Terrorism and Security Bill, including a clear indication of where this requires them to work in collaboration with other authorities.
